jumpers/cardigans.














Absence Request Forms

<u>Clerk to Governors Position Available at Broadmayne</u>

We are looking for a well-organised, reliable, and proactive individual to support our school's governing body. This role is ideal for someone who has strong administrative skills and wants to contribute to the success and smooth operation of the school.

About the role: Clerk to Governors

You would play an essential role in supporting the work of the governing body, ensuring that our meetings and decisions are well organised, accurately documented and effectively communicated. This is a flexible part time role, requiring a commitment of being available during the day and in the evening for meetings, but minutes and agendas can be typed and fitted around your day, so it is a great way of earning some additional money. It is an as and when job, but in general the meetings take a couple of hours. The successful candidate would need to attend 2 meetings per half term, plus of course admin time which amounts to approximately 3 hours following each meeting, so roughly 36 hours per year. The hourly rate of this position would be £12.65.

The key responsibilities include:

- Organising and scheduling meetings
- Taking and distributing minutes
- Managing governing body records
- Providing guidance and support

What we are looking for:

The ideal candidate for this role will:

- Have excellent organisational skills and attention to detail
- Be proficient in basic IT, including word processing and email
- Be able to manage time effectively, work independently, and meet deadlines
- Maintain confidentiality and understand the importance of handling sensitive information with care.

Experience in a similar role or in education is helpful but not required; training will be provided for the right candidate. If you are interested in applying please contact the school office, who will provide you with further information.

The use of WhatsApp at Broadmayne First School

Class or Parent/Carer WhatsApp groups are a very useful and efficient way of communicating to the whole class or groups of parents. The aim of using WhatsApp is to send messages to an entire group, which are relevant to school or to the parents in the group.











The messages in WhatsApp groups either come from parents in their personal capacity or are messages forwarded on behalf of the school. The school does not post directly on any WhatsApp parent/carer groups.

Parents should adhere to the following guidelines when using class WhatsApp groups:

- □ The group should never be used as a platform to air views/grievances regarding a member of staff, child or parent in the class or school
- □ The group should be used keeping in mind mutual respect and cultural sensitivity between all its members
- □ Bullying is not to be tolerated and should be reported.

Please note, the school considers the following online activity inappropriate:

- \square Abusive or personal comments about staff, pupils or other parents
- □ Bringing the school into disrepute
- □ Posting defamatory or libellous comments
- Using social media to publicly challenge school policies or discuss issues about individual children
- □ Threatening behaviour, such as verbally intimidating staff, or using bad language

The school takes safeguarding responsibilities seriously and will deal with any reported incidents appropriately. We thank you for your continued support in safeguarding all members of the Broadmayne community.
