We will be teaching the children that being generous means doing something extra to help and how when we are being generous we do not expect a reward. Our school community over the summer holidays showed huge generosity in helping provide an even better outside learning experience for our children. I have been blown away by people's generosity:

- Our Year 1 outside area is looking incredible, walls have been painted, resources have been made and it is now an accessible area for children to continue their learning outside. A huge thank you to Albie, Freddie, Matilda, Rauri, Clara, Leo, Ewan and Toby's parents for giving up part of their summer to make the area so special.
- Our playground has been brightened up with the awesome artwork of Toby and Ollie's mum. The children have absolutely loved looking at all of the intricate details and each time I spot something I hadn't noticed before. A huge thank you to Emily's mum and Kitty's dad who helped transport and assemble all of the pieces together.











- Julian and Lucy's mum have continued to keep the pool operating with new pieces of machinery and daily maintenance. The pool has required a new chlorinator and heat source pump this year, which have been costly but thanks to the hard work of the FABs team we will continue to have a swimming pool next year.
- Our swim volunteers have enabled children to be able to swim throughout the summer which has been lovely to see, thank you for giving up your time.
- Our paths down to the pool and at the front of the school have encouraged wildlife and have produced a wonderful scent, thank you to Basil and Peony's mum for taking the time to plant the lavender plants.
- Mrs Denning continues to brighten up our school by planting flowers in our tubs and borders.

As you can see we have upgraded the music garden to a new trim trail and I hope that the children will enjoy using this. As we have lots of new equipment we will be timetabling each class to use the trim trail, roundabout, agility equipment and the astro pitch. Each year group will get an opportunity to play football on a weekly basis and this will be supervised by a member of staff. Each piece of equipment needs to be supervised and therefore we politely ask that children do not use the school equipment outside of playtimes and lunchtimes.


